The Anchor Splash Dynasty Continues

The Brothers of Sigma Nu have pulled out their fifth consecutive win in Delta Gamma's Anchor Splash philanthropy event. Anchor Splash consists of a weeklong series of events, culminating in the Anchor Splash swimming event. The event benefits Delta Gamma's Service for Sight foundation.

Delta Gamma's Service for Sight was founded in 1936 to support individuals with visual disabilities. Delta Gamma chapters all across the country work to serve blind and visually impaired individuals of all ages, through volunteering and fundraising. The sisters at DePauw volunteer at local retirement homes throughout the year, and attend and volunteer at the annual Indianapolis VisionWalk. The funds raised through Anchor Splash and the fall semester's Anchor Games goes towards genetics research and life-enhancing programs.



This year's Anchor Splash consisted of daily events leading up to the final event, Anchor Splash. Monday and Tuesday's event was a penny-wars style Most Beautiful Eyes contest. The brothers gathered upwards of \$200, half in pennies, in an attempt to secure 1st place. Sigma Nu wasn't alone in this, however, as many of the other sororities and fraternities also raised large sums of donations. Once the final points were tallied, Sigma Nu came in 10th out of 12 Greek chapters. The next two events were a sheet sign contest and a scavenger hunt.

The final event, Anchor Splash, consisted of 4 different pool-related contests: Save the Mermaid, a race where the swimmers had to tow a sister in an inner tube through one lap of the pool, synchronized swimming, a t-shirt relay race, and a biggest splash contest. Sigma Nu placed first in all but the Save the Mermaid race, securing their 5th consecutive win.
